Why do Catholics do that??

Why did Jesus fall three times in the Way of the Cross?

The Bible does not clearly count how many times Jesus fell on the way to the cross, but in Scripture, three means fullness and completeness.

The First Fall represents Human Weakness. Jesus falls because the Cross is heavy. He is tired, wounded, and in pain. This shows us that Jesus truly became human and suffered as a human.

The Second Fall is the weight of Sin. He is carrying our brokenness, our failures, our sins. This fall teaches us that Sin is heavy. It crushes the soul. But Jesus carries it anyway, for love.

The Third Fall is total Surrender. Jesus is broken, yet He still gets up. Not by strength alone, but by obedience, love, and purpose. This fall teaches us that even when everything feels finished, faith, hope, and love can still stand.

The hidden message in this teaching is that Jesus didn't fall to stay down. He fell, and rose again, each time. So when you fall or fail, know that in Christ, falling is not the end. It is the rising that is holy, not because we are strong, but because His love lifts us up.
